Leeds City Centre Map

New Walkit maps and signs have been placed at key locations all over the city centre. These signs use the same style of map as your printed map, so it makes it even easier to find your way around. They are solar powered, so at night the signs light up. The maps are orientated to the direction you are looking at them, rather than having north at the top.

Abbey House Museum & Kirkstall Abbey

Leeds Industrial Museum at Armley Mills
Formerly one of the world's largest woollen mills, it now houses an award-winning industrial museum which explores the rich industrial past of Leeds, displaying local textiles, printing, cinematography, photography and engineering.

Explore the lives, ailments and treatments of eight Victorian characters and determine if they survive. Step inside the human body to find out how it works.

Temple Newsam House & Park
Explore one of the greatest country houses in England set within beautiful parkland. Enjoy the magnificence of the restored Tudor-Jacobean home and the beauty of the formal walled and wooded lakeside gardens.

Lotherton Hall Estate & Park
This charming gentleman's residence has all the character of an Edwardian country home with a wealth of treasures in every room. Set in beautiful formal, wildflower and wooded grounds, there is also a red deer park and rare and endangered birds' garden.

Middleton Railway
Opened in 1758, it has been described as 'the world's oldest railway'. It is home to 100-year-old steam and diesel locomotives, and has family rides and special events.

Thwaite Mills Watermill Museum
This 19th century water-powered mill once sustained a small, self-sufficient community. Book a tour to explore a unique part of Leeds' industrial heritage.
